#### LOVING GOD AND PEOPLE

Not all debt can be paid with money. Some debt cannot be paid at all. In fact, we owe a number of such debts to God. However, it's not only to God we owe lasting debt. In Romans 13:8-9, Paul says, Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Paul's quotes the Ten Commandments here. (Exodus 20) Note how each command focuses upon treatment of other people. He could have easily added the command to honor parents (12) and not bear false witness (16) to this list. In concluding his thoughts, Paul employed Leviticus 19:18, You shall love your neighbor as yourself. Jesus certainly had this passage in mind when he said, So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets. (Matthew 7:12)

It is easy to urge others to observe "The Golden Rule." We can be like the boy fighting with his brother who, upon his mother's admonition that they ought to act like Jesus, turned to his brother and declared, "She's
